EXHIBITOR PASSES

Passes in the form of wristbands will be issued in relation to the number of entries made as follows (these will be in addition to members/patrons badges issued separately. Under 16years old accompanied by an adult will be entitled to free entry):

1 horse – 2 passes, 2 horses – 3 passes, 3 horses – 3 passes, 4 horses – 4 passes, 5 horses – 4 passes, 6 horses – 5 passes. Extra passes at £12/adult and £8/concessions may be purchased at time of entry.

PLEASE NOTE WRISTBANDS MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES ON THE SHOWGROUND.

This Show is a qualifier for the N.C.P.A. Pony of the Year Show. First and Second Prize winners in appropriate classes will qualify N.C.P.A.No. 157/19

NPS Qualifying Rounds: Affiliation number - S11.019 These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part bred are not eligible for Mountain & Moorland Classes. To compete in Show Pony and Show Hunter Pony classes ponies must be registered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register, Appendix, International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB, the GSB, the AHSB, the AASB or in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part-Breds are not eligible unless entered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register, Appendix, International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult **NPS Qualifying** or **Life members** are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show in 2020

The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.

NPS/Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner's Membership cards **MUST** be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championship

To be judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life Member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the Qualification goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the Owner of that pony is a Member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the Qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships

Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show in August 2020.

NPS Mountain & Moorland In Hand Kilmannan Stud Silver Medal Rosette Championship

A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by The National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by an NPS Qualifying or Life member in the Mountain and Moorland in hand section. The Sponsor's Rosette is also awarded to the pony receiving the Qualification. Membership cards must be presented in the ring to receive the medal and/or qualification (See NPS Silver Medal Championship Conditions in this schedule).

NPS Standinghat Stud & Show Team

Mountain and Moorland Ridden Silver Medal Rosette Championship

A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by an NPS Qualifying or Life member in the Mountain and Moorland Ridden Section. Membership cards must be presented in the ring to receive the medal and/or qualification (See NPS Silver Medal Championship Conditions in this schedule).

SHETLAND PONY STUD BOOK SOCIETY

Classes 263 – 271 incl. are confined to registered ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or eligible for registration (ie. foals)

Three year old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the show. All entire males aged 2 years and over must display a stallion disc.

There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts(excluding foals) or entire males in In Hand classes. Children under 12 yrs old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In Hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats must be worn by all exhibitors irrespective of age, in ridden classes. In ridden classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.

SENIOR SHOWING & DRESSAGE LTD SUMMER CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW

The highest placed home produced senior pony/horse 15 years old and over in relevant sections will qualify for the Summer Championship Show to be held at Onley Equestrian Grounds, Rugby, Warks on 7th and 8th September 2019

Class 254 AMERICAN PURE or PARTBRED Young stock class open to yearlings and 2yr olds any sex.

Class 255 AMERICAN PURE or PARTBRED Adult class open to any sex 3yrs and over any sex

Championship: 1st and 2nd Prizewinners in Classes 254 and 255 go forward to the AMHA Championship

COLOUR SECTION

Class 256 OPEN SOLID COLOUR any age or sex judged 80% colour 20% conformation and type. Any solid colour including dilutes.

Class 257 OPEN ANY OTHER COLOUR any age or sex judged 80% colour and markings 20% conformation and type. Any broken or spotted coat pattern allowed.

TYPE SECTION

Both owner and rider/exhibitor need not be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However in order to qualify both Owner and Rider/Exhibitor need to be a current showing member and present their valid qualifier card IN THE RING for signing by the judge. Member to apply in writing to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card. The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 28th to 31st August 2019. Shows held on or after the postal entry closing date of Championship show will count as 2020 qualifiers. The following classes are CHAPS (UK) Qualifiers – 272 – 276 inclusive. All stallions 4 years old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK). Stallions must wear ID Discs in the ring without exception.

To be led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle, lead rein attached to the nose band only. Mountain and Moorland entries accepted.

Class 279 FIRST RIDDEN PONY, mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, 12.2hh and under. Riders not to have attained their 11th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be shown in any suitable snaffle bridle. Mountain and Moorland entries accepted.

Once a competitor has qualified for the Olympia Grand Final they may continue to compete at any 2nd Round Qualifiers, but they will NOT be eligible to enter the Olympia Qualifying Championships. In this instance the second placed competitor will be eligible for the Championship. CANWELL ESTATE AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY - SHOW RULES

1. **MEMBERSHIP** Membership of the Society shall be open to persons residing on Canwell Estate and to other persons nominated and approved by the Committee. Members shall be allotted one badge (non-transferable) for admission to the Show and Member's Enclosure.
2. **ENTRIES**
 - 2.a. Schedules, with entry forms, are obtainable from the Secretary.
 - 2.b. Entries to be made on the form provided, which should be signed by the Exhibitor, and forwarded to the Secretary by the closing date, together with the entry fee as set out in the Schedule. No return of entry fee will be made unless a written application is received by the Secretary prior to the Show, accompanied by a current Veterinary Surgeon's Certificate (where appropriate).
 - 2.c. The total minimum entry fee is £5.00 per person (Children's Classes excepted).
 - 2.d. The Secretary will acknowledge receipt of entries at least six days prior to the Show in the Marquee Section, other Sections nine days. In case of non-receipt of an acknowledgement, Exhibitors must at once inform the Secretary to this effect.
 - 2.e. The Society reserve the right to cancel or amalgamate any class should there not be sufficient entries.
3. **EXHIBITS**
 - 3.a. All entries are made at the risk of the Exhibitor, the Society accepting no responsibility for loss or damage through any cause whatsoever.
 - 3.b. No distinguishing marks other than numbers, labels, cards etc, allocated by the Society will be permitted on any exhibit until after judging.
 - 3.c. All exhibits and stock generally must be on the Showground and placed in their respective positions by Exhibitors at least 30 minutes before the time given for judging.
 - 3.d. No exhibits in the Livestock Classes may leave the Show before 4.00 p.m.; other exhibits 5.15 p.m.
 - 3.e. Cattle and Horses must at all times be adequately secured.
 - 3.f. Prize winning Livestock must be present for all awards and parade round the Main Ring at such times as the Committee may order. The Committee reserves the right to withhold prize money if prizewinners do not parade.
4. **EXHIBITORS**
 - 4.a. An Exhibitor shall be allowed one Exhibitor's admittance card.
 - 4.b. Exhibitors must obey Officials regarding Health & Safety at all times.
 - 4.c. Any Exhibitor showing an exhibit in any class belonging to another party and entering the same as his or her own, exercising any artifice to deceive the Judges, or otherwise attempting to obtain a prize by unfair means, shall forfeit all claims to any prize which may have been awarded.
 - 4.d. Exhibitors in the Marquee classes must provide their own dishes and stands for exhibits, for which articles the Society will not accept responsibility for loss or damage.
 - 4.e. Winners of Cups and Trophies to return same to the Secretary in good order by the following 24th June, or as directed by the Committee. Failure to comply with this Rule, a charge of £20.00 will be made, plus any expenses incurred to obtain the return of the Cups or Trophies.
 - 4.f. Prize money will be forwarded within 28 days of the Show.
5. **JUDGING**
 - 5.a. Prizes in any class may be withheld by the Judge if exhibits are not up to merit, and no third prize awarded if less than four exhibits in any class, unless specially recommended by the Judge.
 - 5.b. A Judge shall have power to disqualify any exhibits found to be fraudulently dealt with or not in accordance with the classification set out in the Schedule. The decision of the Judge will, in all cases, be Final.
 - 5.c. Only exhibitors and authorised Officials will be allowed in the Rings, and authorised Officials in the Marquees, when judging is in progress.
6. **HEALTH AND SAFETY** This is an agricultural and equine show with livestock attending and participating both in arena and showground events. Livestock can be unpredictable and can be startled by crowds or unusual noises. The Society does consider the health and safety of people and livestock to be of paramount importance and will continue to take every precaution reasonably practical to prevent any accident, injury or illness. Please note however, that the Society will not accept any responsibility for any accident or illness howsoever caused and asks everyone attending to take every precaution to prevent such occurrences.
- 6a. **EQUINE INFLUENZA** All horses and ponies are required to be effectively vaccinated against Equine Influenza and a full vaccination history and passport must be available on request. Horses are to either hold a valid annual vaccination or have had the first two injections of a new course, with the second being administered at least 8 days prior to the show. Foals will not be expected to have commenced their primary course of Influenza vaccination before six months of age.
7. **HATS.** Anyone riding a horse or pony must wear a hard hat of a standard approved by the Governing body under whose rules they are exhibiting and be properly fastened. In any event all equestrian competitors must wear a hard in accordance with British Safety Standard specifications securely fastened whilst mounted.
8. **OBJECTIONS** Any objections and protests to be in writing and lodged with the Secretary during the day of the Show. The objector must at the same time lodge a sum of £20.00 in the hands of the Treasurer, which deposit shall be forfeited if the Committee considers the objection frivolous or without merit and in this respect the Committee's decision shall be final. The Committee, whose decision shall be final, shall decide anything not provided for in the foregoing Show Rules.
